RE: DEPENDENT AUDIT

As you know, the MLC applied for and received a Temporary Restraining Order against the City of New York (July 17) that prohibited the City from "continuing the Insurance Dependent Audit."

In subsequent weeks the City and the MLC met to resolve outstanding issues and came to agreement on most issues.

Despite the progress made in resolving all the issues, and despite the temporary injunction, the City permitted AON to send out a "final notice" letter to City employees. The MLC immediately protested this action as it violates the Temporary Restraining Order and MLC demanded the City issue a new notice that the audit is under legal proceedings with no penalties for those employees who do not timely respond. The MLC told the City that if the issues are not resolved this week, the MLC will return to Court.

Until all outstanding issues are resolved, the MLC recommends that Unions should tell its members they need not respond.

We will keep you informed of new developments.
