

## BUSINESS AS USUAL (1987, 89 min.,



Set in Margaret Thatcher's England of the early 1990's and starring Ewan McGregor and Tara Fitzgerald, *Brassed Off* focuses on a tightly-knit working class community of miners through their involvement in the mine (and town)'s national competitionwinning brass band, led by flinty ex-miner Danny (Pete



Postlethwaite). At times exploring the grim prospects of the soon-to-be-redundant miners, at others the absurdities of the band's musical competition, the film at all times reminds us of the soul of a community being rent by government policies that devalue the residents as workers and human beings.
